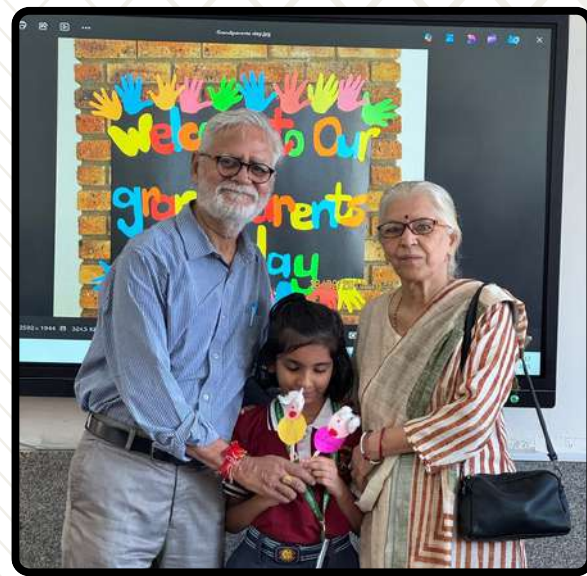

SPORTS ACHIEVEMENTS

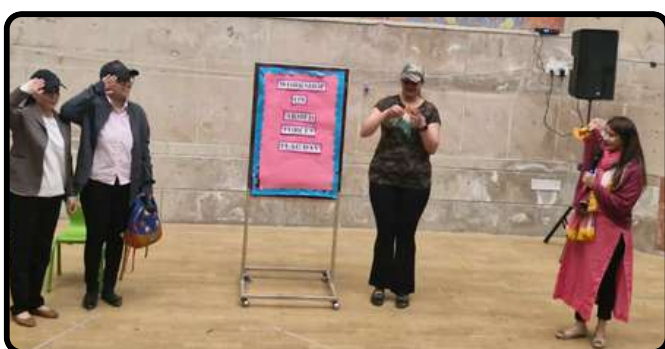
STUDENT ENRICHMENT PROGRAMMES

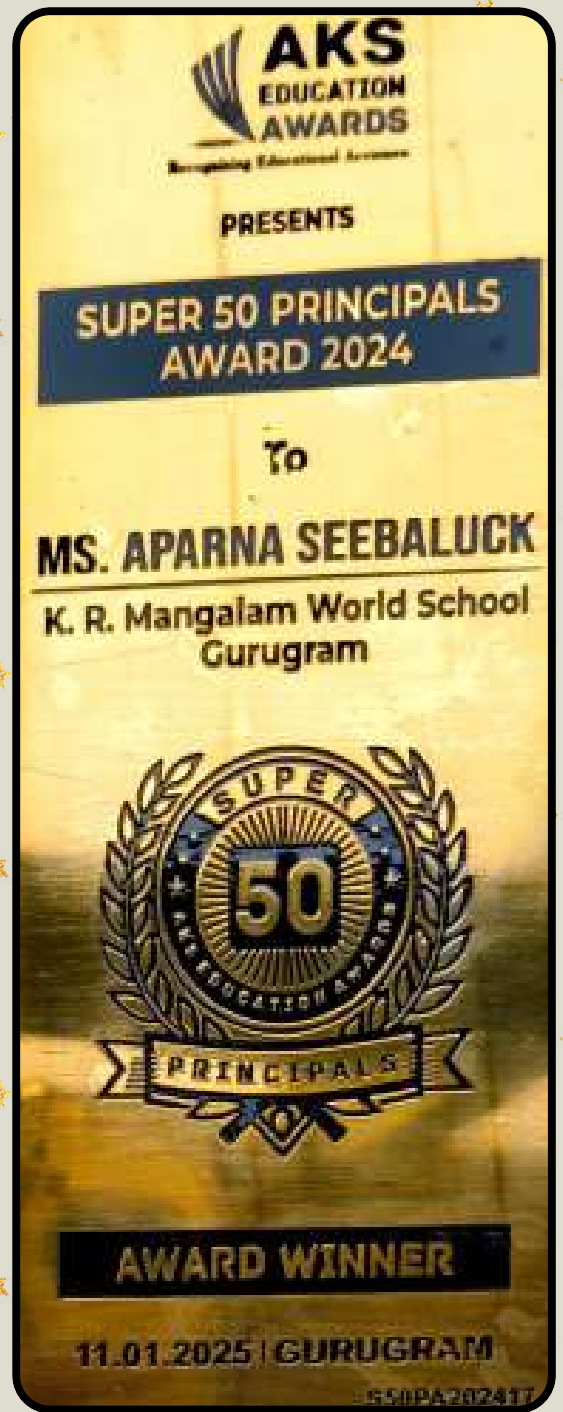
