# FOSTERING GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP



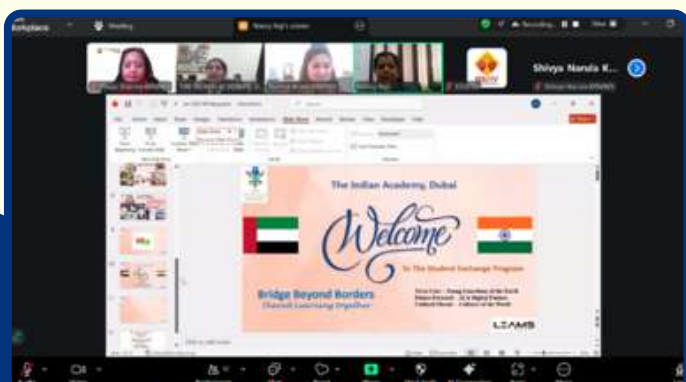
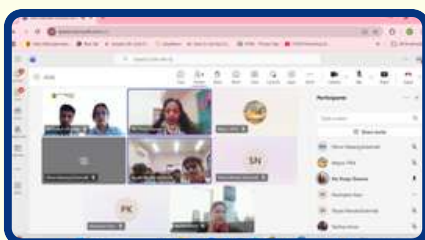
Vaanika Sharma of class VII brought laurels to the school by securing a Consolation Prize in the Japan On Canvas 2025 – 11th National Painting Competition.

# STEAM - ATAL TINKERING LAB & WONDER LAB

The students participated in the Viksit Bharat Buildathon and developed a Smart E-Challan Deduction System using Arduino UNO, RFID Reader, LEDs, and GSM Module. The innovative model automatically scans vehicle Fast-Tags at toll gates, enabling smooth and efficient toll collection. Vehicles with sufficient balance receive a green signal for seamless passage, while insufficient balance triggers an automatic e-challan along with an SMS alert to the owner.



The School's ATL team secured 2nd position in the Path Hack Competition (Line Follower Robot) organized at Birla Vidya Niketan. The autonomous robot, designed using infrared sensors, efficiently followed a marked path with precision by detecting curves and adjusting its movement in real time, showcasing innovation, coding, and robotics skills.

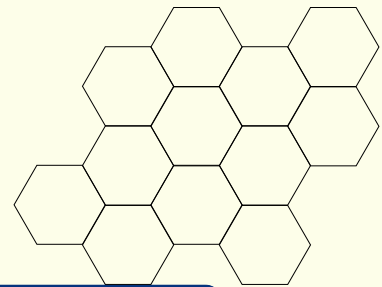
